Bangor University Crustacean Stock Status Assessment - Fisher Science Response.

Due to concerns raised regarding v-notching undersized lobsters, we have re-structured the scheme and it will include the following:

- 1. V-notching lobster that are above 90 mm carapace length. All fishermen will be given a maximum number to notch once the number of fishermen taking part and the budget is finalised.
- 2. Data collection on size, sex and presence of v-notches within catch this can be carried out alongside normal fishing activities.
- 3. Optional banding of undersized lobsters.

Financial compensation will include (all costs are total costs to include any VAT due):

- 1. Flat rate of £12/kg for each lobster v-notched. Weight will be estimated using existing length-weight data
- 2. Cost of fuel when carrying out v-notching.
- 3. £100 plus fuel for a 6-hour day carrying out non v-notching data collection (e.g. data collection and banding). You can also land catch during these trips, the £100 is to compensate for how much data collection will slow your normal fishing activities.
- 4. Any voluntary additional work that can't be carried out alongside normal fishing activities will be compensated at rates to be determined.

Data collection requirements: Training will be provided either through a socially-distanced field visit or through a video tutorial. However, the anticipated minimum data collection requirements will be to:

- 1. Keep a running tally of all lobsters over 90 mm v-notched noting sex and size (camera can be used to capture these data).
- 2. A record of any lobsters landed during the research will be required.
- 3. Data collection days will consist of a record of all catch caught, sex, size and presence of v-notches.

It should be noted that each fisher will be given a maximum number of lobsters to v-notch based on available funds and rate of subscription to the scheme, plus a maximum number of days they can be paid for other data collection activities. This is to ensure that activity does not exceed the available funds.
